eslie Chilton, who has long been the daily force behind our Alcohol and Substance Awareness Program (ASAP), has been promoted to ASAP Program Manager, a position she has certainly earned.

ASAP is the public inebriate program of LCMHS. It provides screening services and a temporary, safe, substance

-free bed for individuals under the influence of drugs or alcohol. ASAP diverts many individuals from detention in a jail cell until they are no longer incapacitated. Then ASAP can provide supports and referrals to community resources that are available to help with issues of concern to the individual and/or his or her family related to alcohol and other drug use.


